Since my other thread was locked, I'll repost this. Hopefully with a better explanation of what is happening.

To get around the bug where posts are not marked as read when read once, I use the "mark this forum read"-button. Which does not do the job fully either. Thread which should be marked as read, are not marked as such.

I use Firefox 2.0.0.1 on Win XP SP2.

So, what I do is this:

1. Start Firefox
2. Go to http://elektron-users.com/index.php?option=com_fireboard&Itemid=28 (the forum link)
3. Ctrl-click all subforums that contain unread topics to open them in a new tab in FF
4. Go through each subforum and ctrl-click the topics I want to read to open them in a new tab in FF
5. When all interesting topics for a subforum has been read, I click the "mark this forum read"-button
6. Repeat from step 2 until all forums have no new posts that I want to read.
7. Reload the http://elektron-users.com/index.php?option=com_fireboard&Itemid=28 (the forum page) which now shows all forums and topics as read and not containing any new posts
8. Wait a couple of hours (I might shut down the computer here)
9. If necessary, start FF and reload the forum start page (http://elektron-users.com/index.php?option=com_fireboard&Itemid=28)
10. Ctrl-click all subforums that contain unread topics to open them in a new tab in FF
11. Go through each subforum to see what topics there are

Result:

Some of the topics that I marked as read on step 5 are now marked as unread, even though no new post have been made in them.

Expected:

Topics with no new posts in them to stay marked as read.

Anyway, back to the main point which was a feature request. I will likely update the placement to try to accomodate your preference but it won't be any time soon. I'm currently focused on actual bugs.

Ok, I'm pretty confused what you mean by most your post, so I'm gonna break it down in questions my little brain and conceive of:

What does this mean? The stylesheet of the forum while viewing whether one is logged in or not logged in are all working fine for me in: Safari, FF, and IE 6 & 7. It's possible I don't understand. In order to see the buttons "reply, quick reply, quote, etc" you have to be a registered user and logged in.

Specifically, quotes from a previous post are not wrapped within an individual div, so they have the same color as the body of the new post, which makes it hard to differentiate between the two. The formatting is working on this page but doesn't work when just browsing.

There are different ways methods of quoting. One by hitting 'Quote' in the main thread window, or using the BBCode quote like i did just above ^ to highlight your text. Now if you mean the style when in a reply, the colors i show in Safari, FF, both IE's are a light blue & white. With quoted text have a light grey dash surrounding the post.

Not sure I understand the issue. I can place a more obvious border around the quoted text if necessary, but it's viewable here for me.

Sorry if someone has pointed this out already, I'm too lazy to browse through all the pages of this topic right now.

Also, on IE7, the RSS tag and forum post tool drop down are hovering above the right scrollbar in the forum div.

I will look fixing this once I get home, currently on vacation, but as I noted in the original version 2 thread, I'm not supporting IE 6 or 7. I have made a special stylesheet to try to accommodate anyone using IE, in an attempt to make sure they're having the same browsing experience. For optimal viewing on this site, I only support browsers that adhere to W3C standards. If the IE 7 bug is simple, I will definitely try to fix.

What I meant was that on the page where you are actually writing a new post, you know, with the textbox at the top and the forum beaneath it....the forum is styled differently than when you are just browsing the site.

The way I see it right now on IE7 - I am writing this post and below this text box that I'm writing in are the forums with every alternating post having a blue background for ease of viewing. This kind of formatting with alternating blue backgrounds does not show up if I'm just browsing the forum normally. They appear to have different styles.

This is a good suggestion. I will make an effort to get brackets and possibly even the a different color into the pagination next week. on coding hiatus while on vacation :)

I just checked this in IE6. Everything is displaying as it should. I am using 'overflow scrollbars' for all the browsers. What this means is that images larger than 490px can be used but extend beyond the width of the message window. Therefor if a image of 800px is linked horizontal scrollbars then become active.

My hope in the future is that everyone will obey the width requirement of the new forum. In Xoops, we had it so that all images wider then the width of the message window would be truncated. Which while effective in maintaining width requirements, left many folks confused as to where the rest of their image went. I'm hoping the horizontal scrollbars will be a better solution and cause less confusion.

One nice thing about the BBC code on this site, that any user can easily adjust their image width with this code links in the leftside signature that are longer than the area reserved to them... but as IE6 is not supported and I'm not using it as my default browser, that's okay. Have to check Opera as well.

Yeah, this is quandary I'm facing. I was hoping to not force users into width requirements in the signature column, but I am starting to think my hope was fleeting. Also, as far as browsers, what you see in IE6 with widths is what you'll see in Firefox & Safari as well. I'm still actually baffled that anyone smart enough to buy a Elektron product would use IE. :)

EDIT: So now anyone's links in the signature column that extend beyond the width requirements is truncated visually. The links though truncated visually still work as they're intended.

this isn't an error, and i have already spoke on this within this very thread. currently if people post images larger then 490px it will create horizontal scrolling. i did this because on the older site inevitably every week i'd have to reply to a post where someone had posted a large image and it got truncated. so then i would tell them all images larger then will be automatically cropped.

so on this site this version i decided to let users be responsible for their own sizing. if users can't obey the size restrictions of the message window it will still post the image but create horizontal scroll bars.

your idea is the old way of doing things. which in the end means more work for me. it is possible to post larger pictures now, post them as smaller, and then make them clickable. you can see this 'clickable' photo option in this thread:

in the above photo i've done nothing more then click and use the 'Boardcode' default (img) tag. needlessly to say this works, but it requires users to use the feature appropriately. when some posts a photo, and uses the 'Boardcode', the (img) tag automatically defaults with a (img size=470). if the image is larger the image will be clickable and have a ' + ' in the right hand corner indicating it as such. so it's already enabled, but requires user to either use the sites (img) tag by default or take the time to edit their posts if the thread width is blown.

i really don't know what more to do to assist. the tools are in place, i have made the (img) tag default to 470px...it's all there. the horizontal scroll bars are even in place for those whose images break the forum width. i feel the current way works best. while i'm the admin, and we have moderators, users are empowered with the tools to make their images and this forum look either tidy or like shit. the path of least resistance in this situation was to create tools that cater too all scenarios.

i hope this clears it up for you.
