Also, only one entry per pairing.

EDIT Entries are due on Jan. 20, 2009 in mp3 and sysex format.

EDIT Please submit the sysex, the recorded mp3, and any samples you might have used. Since the files section can only host files up to 8MB in size, anything larger than 8 MB will have to be hosted off-site.

Hopefully folks will find ways to work that's best for them both. Just remember you'll want to capture as much of the tweaking, filtering, etc in the machines. that way you can send the Sysex to your partner and they can add, edit and make even more patterns, etc. Doing all real time tweaks and recording direct to a DAW isn't going to be make it very collaborative at all because you're partner is relying on your mix down and not your actual patterns, song, etc.
Again, do whatever you guys want, but remember aside from the SID there's no overdubbing or external processing. PIMP YOUR BOX.

Science Labs are typically "challenges" to create a song/sketch/piece using a very limited set of parameters on either the Machinedrum or the Monomachine. For instance, in the past, we had a Science Lab which consisted of making a song using just the noise machine on the Monomachine. Usually, no external processing or external anything is permitted -it's just you, the elektron, and one synth machine. This time around, for SL01, we tried something we've not done before: collaboration between forum members. Pairs/teams are allowed to use the elektron and that's it -- no external processing, etc. Visuals are not part of the science labs. Science labs are a chance to explore the machine in a really focused manner. If you're interested in sharing patches, etc. I would post in the sandbox forum -- just make sure that you include an explanation. Hope that explains things. M PS welcome to the board!
