i would like to hear a version with super clean phat compressed glassy drum sounds, so as to keep the bass frequency spectrum kind of more clear for the bass synth to inhabit fully.

the keys chords around 2:25 remind me of Joe Zawinul's playing on a track from "Black Market" by Weather Report.

love that waving bass sound around 3:15, incredible work.

the drum pattern programming on Dark Hour also reminds me of the drumming and percussion on that seminal fusion album called Black Market (drums/percussion achieved by Chester Thompson, Narada Michael Walden, Don Alias, and Alejandro Neciosup Acuna).

Dark Hour is quite an exotic offering.

i thought perhaps the high chord could maybe fade out quicker, leaving the bass and the oboe type of sound going? just an idea. cheers for the share!
