There is no mentioning about how to use it so my first tip would be hold down play and turn the data encoder for selecting the different parts. The second one would be saving a multi is done in the same way as saving a patch which will also let you name your multi. One thing I've noticed though is that it seems like I'm running out of voices very quickly, but I have to investigate that further.

In my opinion they have made a big mistake marketing wise though. They should have enabled playing of the new samples and locked down the ability to load new ones so to give a teaser and an incentive to buy an unlock code for that. Try before you buy is always a good thing. It would also be the decent thing to do for their loyal user base who have been waiting so long for this fix.

I just got my grubby mitts on this little beastie (desktop Blofeld) and am fairly impressed so far. A couple of problems, however: (1) contrary to what the manual states, changing delay length in real time creates clicking artifacts. This is not just your typical stepping artifacts, it's full-on clipping garbage and completely ruins the sound--very disappointing! (2) I also notice some strangeness when using the USB MIDI interface, sometimes parameters lag or aren't available when sequencing via USB, the volume knob in particular. (3) There is very obvious noise floor when using headphones. It seems to increase when the unit has been idle, appearing as low level bursts of interference when no sound is present. Thankfully the main outputs don't seem to be marred by this problem, but it's still annoying, especially if you plan on using the headphone outputs with any frequency.

I don't think consider any of the above major deal breakers for me, but why do I get the feeling Waldorf like to put out partially completed products? Some of the bugs reported in early revisions seem even more serious than anything I mentioned. The Blofeld has been out for over a year, surely Waldorf could iron out most of the major (and even some of the minor) bugs by now? Given Waldorf's inconsistency and slowness to deliver on promised features (multitimbral operation... hello?), I can only imagine the sampling option will be similarly flummoxed from the get go.

User sampled waves is certainly a feature high on my list. But I hope it is implemented in a usable and interesting way (hopefully in similar way to wavetable modulation). Sample start/end, loop point should all be modulate-able. I pray they don't just bolt-on a ROMpler and expect us to shell out \$150 for it.

Being able to run multisamples in any format through the synthesis engine of the Blofeld is basically what I wanted from the EOS series samplers - IMO it's nothing to scoff at.

Indeed, this is kinda basic 'workflow' on the Blofeld. The multimode only provides multitimbrality and has no sound edit mode (yet) like a virus, for example.

So the key is to accept it and change your workflow. Try to shape your sounds 'as good as possible', from the start, and just make some final edits if needed.

Waldorf should ever get away with it, cause the Blofeld still offers great value for the money ;)

Personally, I (tried but) do not use the multimode, because it seems not reliable yet. I don't really need it either. But still, Blofeld is one of my favourite synthesizers...
